SCHOOL PROFILE

Santa Fe Catholic is fully accredited by AdvancED, formerly Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS).



Santa Fe Catholic High School is a college preparatory school that serves ninth through twelfth grade students. A coeducational institution of the Diocese of Orlando, Santa Fe Catholic officially opened on September 5, 1961. The 40-acre campus is located between Lakeland and Winter Haven and serves all of Polk County and the surrounding area.

Approximately 98% of Santa Fe Catholic graduates attend four-year colleges. The academic year consists of 36 weeks per year, and is divided into four nine-week grading periods. Semester grades, given twice a year, earn one-half credit for every course passed with a D or above. Exam grades make up 20% of each semester's grade. The two nine-week grades make up 80% of the semester grades. GPA is based on a 4.0 scale. Weighted grades for honors, advanced placement and dual enrollment courses enable a student to obtain a GPA higher than 4.0.

Santa Fe Catholic High School, a ministry of the Catholic Diocese of Orlando, offers a program of college preparatory studies encompassing values grounded in the Gospel of Jesus Christ and serves the families of the surrounding communities. Through academic, spiritual, athletic, artistic, extracurricular and service programs, the school endeavors to further its mission of ***"Developing each student fully as a child of God."***

Available Courses

College Preparatory: These courses are designed to challenge students.

Honors: These courses are designed to meet the needs of students who are capable of more challenging coursework. Students, who earn grades of C and above, receive 0.5 additional quality points.

Dual Enrollment: Courses are available to juniors and seniors with overall GPA of 3.0 or higher on Santa Fe Catholic's campus through St. Thomas University and Polk State College. St. Thomas University also offers online options. Students have the opportunity to go to the local colleges to take dual enrollment as well. Students receive additional 1.0 quality points for a C or better in Dual Enrollment courses.

Advanced Placement: The courses present college level material and conclude with students taking Advanced Placement tests, administered by the College Board. Students are required to take the Advanced Placement test if they take an Advanced Placement course. Successful performance on the examination may result in college credit. Students receive additional 1.0 quality points for a C or better in Advanced Placement courses.
